## Self assessment – an ongoing part of the junior and senior year experience

- Students need to spend time figuring out what's important to them in the post-high school planning process. College? 2-year or 4-year? Work? Apprenticeship? Military? Gap year? # Office of Admissions

- Colleges seek the best “fit” students to find/attract/admit/enroll for their entering class
- Students seek the best “fit” college they can attend
- Numbers are important – not just in terms of applications, but in terms of a student’s academic record. And some colleges got a lot of application last year!
- It’s a process, with lots of steps/stages. Patience is a value-added virtue!

# Office of Admissions – Changes from COVID-19

- Most colleges have adopted a test-optional policy in admission. That said, some colleges still like to see a test score for certain majors, honors programs and scholarships. Be sure to do your research and ask questions!

- The optional writing section in the SAT has been eliminated. The SAT Subject Tests have been eliminated. The number of colleges requiring an ACT test with writing is about six – students don't typically need to do the optional writing section. Please note, **West Point** is a college that still requires the writing portion.
- Most colleges and universities require registration for a campus tour. Many have added significantly to their YouTube campus tour productions. It's important to check a college's "visit" website before scheduling a trip!

## Holistic review – what's most important?

- The high school transcript – the student's record of academic achievement – is the most important part of the application folder.
- The rigor of the courses you have taken, the breadth of study within each department, and the grades you have earned will be examined in detail. The transcript speaks loudly.
- Colleges and universities want to see the quality of your life as a student. They want to see trends, growth, challenge, and achievement.

- What do you hate to do?
- What subject excites you?
- What always bores you?
- How do you learn best?

## Self inventory (cont.)

- Do you enjoy being a part of a large group? Or do smaller groups suit you better?
- Do you want to stick close to home? Or do you plan to move far away?
- Do you want to live in or near a city? Or could you find happiness in a college town?
- Do you seek out diversity among your friends? Or do you hang out with people who are very similar to you?

# Applying for admission – it happens in the senior year!

- Focus as much on “going” to the college as you will focus on “getting in.”
- As a counseling staff, we plan to work with students in the college search process to help them find good matches!!

## Applying for admission (continued)

- As you get ready to become an applicant, your top priority is finding the right fit!
- Most MHS seniors apply between August and December
- Separate deadline for need-based financial aid -- filing the FAFSA can be done in December. [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)
- Determine which application plan/option works best for you (Early Decision, Early Action, Regular Decision or Rolling)
- The selection process can last for months, especially when cost of attendance is a significant factor.

# Applying for admission – next steps

- Attend the in-person and virtual college admission visits this fall – see Naviance for the full list (in the Colleges tab)
- MEA week travel – seniors have off that Wednesday!
- Arrange a meeting with your school counselor or post-secondary counselor
- Fill out the Transcript Release form
